WHAT IS TFT?

f you have been in our ICS hallways, you cannot help but hear about Teaching for Transformation (TfT). **Teaching for Transformation is designed to combine excellent educational practices with an intentional Christian mindset.** In other words, kids get to learn really well while also understanding their individual role in God's story. Here are some TfT components that highlight the richness of this program at ICS.

TfT learning begins with a **Deep Hope**. Each teacher has prayed and thought through their Deep Hope for themselves and their students and answered the question: What is the purpose and calling of my classroom to help students see and live God's story?

Next, teachers develop a **Storyline** for their classroom, a statement that uses our school's Throughlines to connect their Deep Hope to a compelling vision of God's kingdom. Storylines connect learners and learning to God's story.



Throughlines are "Habits of Living" that we desire our students to embody. They include things like Servant Working, Community Building, Earth Keeping, and Justice Seeking. These ideas run through every part of our curriculum and help our students to reflect Jesus. TfT also employs **Habits of Learning**, including Curious Thinking, Gracious Communicating, Joy-Filled Collaboration, and Courageous Designing. These concepts work in tandem to build students' minds and character.

Another key practice of TfT involves **Formational Learning Experiences**. These FLEx opportunities ask students to engage in real work that meets the real needs of real people. Teachers invite students to use their skills, then nurture and empower them to tackle real-life problems. The FLEx opportunities allow students to practice Habits of Learning and Habits of Living!

FINE ARTS

t Intermountain Christian School students have an opportunity to explore and discover the Arts in various facets.

Our Theater Department boasts exceptional productions in which students from multiple school levels can be involved. Whether it's through the production team, set design, program development, hair and makeup or on-stage performing, our theater students gain **THEATER** a vast knowledge of what it takes to put on a professional stage production.

The Art Department provides students from 1st-12th grades the opportunity to explore various art forms. Students discover mediums such as painting, drawing, ceramics and sculpture. They are encouraged to view art through the eyes of the ultimate artist, God. Visual arts provide students the opportunity to experience God through the arts and to worship Him through finished works. Students learn to embrace the motto, "there are no mistakes in art, only discoveries."

The Dance Program at ICS provides students an avenue to worship the Lord through movement. The program provides dance technique and performance opportunities for K-12th grades. Students are introduced to the gift of movement and learn the beauty of offering choreography as worship to God.

An education in music can be a holistic tool used throughout one's entire lifetime. Our music department aims to cultivate classes that equip each student to not only perform beautiful pieces, but also to express and process emotions, serve their community and understand God's intent and purpose for the gift of music. Classes will discover these values through a variety of mediums such as semester concerts and our annual Music Tour which includes an introduction to music therapy and various small performances throughout the community. Classes offered in the upper school include hand bells, choir, ensemble and worship band.

SPOTLIGHT: THEATER

ere at ICS, theater is offered as a year-long elective to middle school and high school students. Each course starts with learning about the stage, our classroom. While the majority of time is devoted to the art of acting, students also study different aspects of theater including theater history, jobs in the field of theater and practical theater such as costumes, tech and stage combat. Each year the high school students discuss and experience the techniques of different theater theorists, like Meisner and Stanislavski, for example. Class performances are designed to feature the size and talents of each individual group, created with input from the students, and presented to fellow students and family members.

Each year, we offer a theater season of two to three main stage productios in our Black Box Theater. The shows are cast through auditions and are open to all middle and high school students. Some productions are high school only (such as You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown), most include a middle and high school cast, and usually there is one production each season that will include roles for elementary students, as well.

The theater community at ICS is growing and is a wonderful tool to use our gifts for God's glory and to unite us, as three schools on one campus.

FIELD STUDIES

igh School students at ICS are afforded the opportunity to participate in annual field studies trips in the spring. The senior class is in charge of planning their own senior trip and the remaining grade levels are able to choose from 4 trips planned by the faculty. Field studies is an educational experience that contributes to academic learning as well as community building. In addition, participating students receive .25 credit toward graduation requirements. Past location examples include Arizona, California, Canada, Massachusetts, Mexico, New York, Oregon, and Wyoming. The cost of these trips is included in tuition and classes begin fundraising for their senior trip during their junior year.



RETREAT

A t ICS, our students thrive most when they feel like they are part of our community. At the beginning of each school year, the entire high school participates in a high school retreat. The retreat is typically two days spent at Big Canyon Ranch in Wanship, UT. Activities and events are planned by student council during the preceding summer. Student Council introduces a "theme" for the year and selects a speaker to lead several sessions during the retreat. Time is allotted for small groups to expound upon the lessons provided by the speaker and to get to know one another better. Activities are designed to build community and give interaction that can't be achieved at school.

This valuable experience often sets the tone for the year in our high school. Giving students the opportunity for spiritual refreshment and building relationships proves to be a wonderful way to begin a new year, and it is a particular joy to watch God work in the lives of our students during that time. Our high school retreat is a uniquely ICS tradition that remains a favorite for our community!


